- Problem solve with individual providers, teams and building level leaders to ensure quality interventions.
- Assist in the planning, implementation and evaluation of student support systems and/or the modification of existing systems to meet the unique learning needs of students. Collaborate with student success staff to assure consistent provision of district-wide services.
- Allocate resources based on school and programming needs.
- Demonstrate a commitment to all students learning at optimal and equitable levels.
- Supervise/support Student Success staff.
- Perform other duties as assigned.
