

MONEY MANAGEMENT AND PERSONAL FINANCE GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

Dear student and parent,

BVSD graduation requirements specify that all students must have evidence of the completion of a 12 clock-hour course in money management and personal finance. This requirement can be met in one of two ways:

- In grades 9-12, the following courses meet the Money Management requirement:
 - B42 Finance
 - B51 Financial Records
 - B53 Accounting 2
 - B60 Business Management
 - H51 Living on Your Own - semester
 - H53 Life Management 2
 - H81 Wage Earning
 - V52 Banking & Service Accounting 2
 - B47 Mathematical Business Applications
 - B52 Accounting 1
 - B54 Advanced Accounting Systems
 - H50 Living on Your Own – year
 - H52 Life Management 1
 - H54 Living on Your Own – semester 2
 - V51 Banking & Service Accounting 1

OR

- In grades 11-12, completion of a district-approved online course (available now).

Enrolling in the online money management and personal finance course

- The online course fulfills the money management graduation requirement for the district.
- This course can be taken exclusively at home or any location where there is a computer with Explorer 5.0 or later, an internet connection (high speed internet is suggested) and an available printer.
- To access the course, you will need to type in this address:

- Once there you should click on the green 'Enroll' tab along the top of the screen. The student enrollment page should appear.
- To fill out the form, you will need to create a username and password. It is suggested that you use your first and last name with no spaces for the username. **You will also need to know your BVSD ID number to complete the form.**
- After submitting your enrollment, login with your username and password, click on the "Active Courses" tab on the top of the page, and begin the "Money Management and Personal Finance" course.
- Please make sure you read all of the information and follow the directions carefully.
